


COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course gives an overview of historical and contemporary context in South Africa. It offers a timeline of significant events that has shaped South African politics, culture and society. It summates by connecting the past to the present by touching on key concepts such as:

- Slavery
- A journey into the history of the Khoi San dispossession in the Cape
- Colonialism (British and Dutch expansion in South Africa)
- Apartheid and resistance
- Culture, heritage and citizenship
- Post-apartheid South Africa
- South African music, art and poetry

Participants will develop a local insight into the current African contexts, opportunities and challenges of transformation and gain an understanding of the way history has shaped Cape Town and South Africa.

SOCIAL JUSTICE AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP



COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course dives into social justice in the context of South Africa. It looks at the root causes of injustice in society and examines the concept of wealth distribution, opportunities, resources as well as privileges. The objective is to offer participants a perspective on the intersecting pressures of society that makes social justice difficult to achieve and therefore, seek solutions within their own context. The course focuses on:

- Social justice activism
- Seeking social justice and solutions through entrepreneurial ideas
- Groups and organisations
- Innovation in the arts and social justice in Africa
- Social entrepreneurship
